Camp Shingobee Timbers

Hackensack, MN

Located about two hours north of St. Cloud on the shores of Big Bass Lake, Camp Shingobee Timbers is surrounded by the Chippewa National Forest. Campers can choose canoeing, kayaking, swimming, hiking, cooking over a fire, archery, crafts, skits/songs around the amphitheater, and team building. The high and low challenge courses are your chance to push yourself to the limit!

Located about an hour southwest of St. Cloud on 33 wooded acres in Spicer, MN, the property is bordered by Nest Lake on two sides and Glacial Lakes State Trail on another. Camp Sanderson has a beautiful lake with swimming and boating, archery range, arts and craft pavilion, amphitheater, and the Bernice Harper hiking trail.

Permanent canvas-sided tent cabins with single beds and/or bunk beds, composting toilets, flush toilets and showers in Program Center. Counselors sleep in a separate tent cabin within the same unit.




Camp Roundelay

Minong, WI

Located about an hour south of Duluth in the Gordon-Wascott area of Wisconsin, Camp Roundelay is located on 620 acres. It has two private lakes, a shower house, established waterfront and boating area, miles of hiking trails, amphitheater, and the Bernick's Storm Shelter. Camp Roundelay offers horse lovers the opportunity to learn about, ride, and care for horses.

Screened stick-built cabins (no electricity), latrines, and shower house. Camp counselors sleep in cabins with girls.

Let's Get Started!

Choose a Troop Camp Level that best suits the experience your troop is looking for

Level 1

First-time, novice, or any troop looking to learn outdoor skills with the support of camp counselors who will assist in leading ALL camp activities.

Camp provides all meals (in the dining hall or picnic style), equipment, supplies, and trained/certified staff for specialized activities such as swimming, boating, archery, etc.

Cost applies to Girl Scout youth and adults attending Troop Camp Level 1.

Level 2

For troops who have some outdoor experience and have a troop leader with Outdoor Skills Training and CPR/First Aid Training. Staff assist with specialty activities and the troop supplements all others. Check the Program Guide to obtain Outdoor Skills Training through the Adult Retreat Weekends or TOTG (Training on the Go).

Camp Provides one meal a day (dinner on your first day, lunch on the remaining days); all other meals are brought and prepared by your troop over a fire or propane stove. Limited food storage will be available in the dining hall.

Staff assist with specialty areas, such as swimming, boating, archery, etc. Troops will be responsible for planning all other activities including supplies.

Cost applies to Girl Scout youth and adults attending Troop Camp Level 2.

Level 3

For advanced troop campers who have completed both Level 1 and Level 2 and are looking for a more rustic adventure. One leader must have Outdoor Skills Training and CPR/First Aid Training.

Troops sleep in tents in pre-existing primitive campsites. Staff are available to assist with specialty areas such as swimming, boating, archery, etc.

The troop is responsible for planning all other activities, including supplies. Each troop plans their own meals ahead of time, brings their own food, and will cook over an open fire or propane stove. Limited food storage is available in the dining hall.

Cost applies to Girl Scout youth and adults who attend for a reduced rate.

Level 3 is available at camps Roundelay and Shingobee Timbers. Contact customer care to inquire about dates and availability at customercare@girlscoutslp.org

Troop Camp Registration Guidelines and Tips

Help Girl Scouts go green by registering online through your online **MYGS** account, **My Events** tab. Registration AND deposits are required to secure your troop camp spot on the roster! Spaces are “live” and are available on a first come first serve basis.

*Note: *There can be more than one troop registering for one space at a time and the space may be filled by the time you complete your registration.*

*Note of Grade Levels: **Grade levels listed on troop camp horseback or challenge course options reflect the school grade your camper is currently in.*

Online Registration – My Events through MYGS Account (preferred method of registration):

Step 1: Head to www.girlscoutslp.org and click “MYGS” on the website header.

Step 2: Log into your MYGS Account.

Step 3: Once logged into your MYGS click the “MY Events” tab on the left side of the screen to view upcoming sessions and see capacity availability.

- Click the “Register for another event” under My Events page

You will need to search camp sessions by using the zip code at Camp

Step 4: Find the perfect session by reviewing the Event Search options

- Scroll through the options and click “Event Details” below the listing to get registered.
 - Review session details on the left of the screen
 - Add Girl and/or Adult spots by using the + icon
 - Note: to serve as many youth as possible, we’d like you to limit the number of adults to those required for camping/travel away from meeting space.
 - Click Add EVENTS button
- *Make note that spaces may fill/sell out during the registration process!

Step 5: Register by Adding your details

- Assign attendees (who will be attending the session)
- If you are the Troop Leader you must choose between Family & Troop Attendees. Once you choose from the drop down you cannot go back!
- If you are a parent you will only have access to those in your household.

Step 6: Pay deposit

- Secure your space by paying the \$25 Troop Camp deposit. All registrations require a deposit (non-refundable) that will be applied toward your camp fee.
- Review your cart
 - Verify your session and participants

Step 7: Once your registration has been processed you will receive an automated email registration confirmation. This should happen within 24 hours and includes link to all the camp forms.

- Mail in product program credits prior to full payment deadline (four weeks prior to your camp session)

How Many Adults Do We Need?

- All adult volunteers are expected to follow the guidelines in Volunteer Essentials for all travel with their troop.
- Additional adults needed beyond those needed to fulfill a troop's safety ratios, may attend. *All adults attending Troop Camps at any level must currently be registered members of Girl Scouts for the 2024-2025 membership year and have cleared a background check compliant with GSMWLP Policy #8203.*
- If driving any girls other than their own daughter and /or handling Girl Scout Finances, adults must also have completed a background check through Lakes and Pines within the last three years, as well as hold a valid driver's license and insurance.
- All Girl Scout Troop Camps are alcohol, drug, and tobacco-free.

Camp Forms

You will find the Troop Camp Participant Packet, Activity List, Troop Checklist, Packing List, Statement of Consent, and the Minor and Adult Health History Record on the Forms section of our website, www.girlscoutslp.org. Forms from all of your girls will need to be signed and submitted **4 weeks** before you come to camp. Please keep a copy and do not send originals.

Tips for using GSMWLP Fall Bucks, Cookie Dough Credits, etc. for troop camp payment:

- Mail or walk-in credits to the Waite Park or Duluth Regional office ASAP to have your gsEvents account credited before the full payment date. Please include details on how you would like the credit applied (camper name, session to apply credit)
 - Waite Park: GSMWLP, 400 Second Ave South, Waite Park, MN 56387
 - Duluth: GSMWLP, 2122 W. Superior Street, Suite 1, Duluth, MN 55806
- Fall Bucks and Cookie Dough can only be used on girl fees. Adventure Point Credits can be used on girl or adult fees. Camp Care Day credits can be applied to girl or adult balances.
- All camp care day credits will be placed on gsEvents Accounts (after sign-in sheets are returned from camp care day, don't forget to sign in!). Participants can use up to three credits (\$45) on one session.

Cookies and Nuts can get you to Camp! (Activity Credits)

Girl Scout camp is powered by the Girl Scout Product Program: Fall Product Program and the Girl Scout Cookie Program!

Sellers receive credits (Fall Bucks, Cookie Dough, Adventure Points) to help pay for summer camp programs and items purchased in the Girl Scout retail shops and camp trading posts. Girl Scouts Lakes & Pines encourages Girl Scout youth to participate in the Product Programs to create goals and assist in earning their way to camp!

Camper participation in the product programs helps the council cover the overhead expenses associated with camp such as property maintenance, utilities, insurance premiums and more!

Each camp session requires a non-refundable deposit (\$15, \$25 or \$50 dependent on session cost), but the remaining balance can be paid with Activity Credits. To apply activity credits to a camp balance simply bring in or mail the credits to our Waite Park Office with a note indicating to which camper and which program the credits should be applied.

**Please allow up to two weeks for processing, you will be able to see the credit on your gsEvents balance once applied. All camp balances are due four weeks prior to session start date.*

Northern Lakes Canoe Base

Troop Camp Cancellation/Refund and Transfer Policy

Full Refund: If we are unable to place your troop in your session of choice or if the session is canceled by council personnel for extenuating circumstances, the total amount paid will be refunded.

Partial Refund: The balance of the camp fees, minus the deposit, will be refunded ONLY if:

- A written request is made from the parent/guardian – it must include a statement from a licensed professional or attending physician noting camper is unable to attend. Contact us in advance, and documentation must be received within two weeks following the start date of the session.
- A written request from the parent/guardian may be made for critical immediate family emergencies. A cancellation call must be made, and a message left before or within two days of the session's start date.
- Partial Refund minus the deposit + 20% of the session fee; If none of the above apply and cancellation is more than 4 weeks before the session.

No Refund:

- None of the above applies and cancellation is less than 4 weeks before the session.
- Campers who leave early due to homesickness, parental request, or behavior expectation problems.

Financial Assistance (Camp Scholarships)

Scholarship Funds are available for girl members of Girl Scouts, Lakes' and Pines. To request a partial scholarship, send the Scholarship Funds Application to be considered, this form must be completed in its entirety signed by the parent/guardian. Funds are awarded on a first come first serve basis.
