# Our Camps

Girl Scouts Lakes & Pines has four unique camps spread throughout Minnesota and northwestern Wisconsin. Whether you love a high challenge course adventure and zip lining, horseback riding, state biking trails, the lake, or pretty much any outdoor amenity, our camps have got you covered!

In addition to meeting the established standards for health, safety, program and personnel criteria set by federal, state and local governments, our camps meet the standards set by Girl Scouts of the USA. Camps Roundelay (WI), Sanderson (MN), and Shingobee Timbers (MN) are proud to be accredited by the American Camp Association (ACA), a national organization and industry leader that sets high standards for the health and safety of campers and staff, and the delivery of quality programs.



## Camp Shingobee Timbers

Hackensack, MN

Located about two hours north of St. Cloud on the shores of Big Bass Lake, Camp Shingobee Timbers is surrounded by the Chippewa National Forest. Campers can choose canoeing, kayaking, swimming, hiking, cooking over a fire, archery, crafts, skits/songs around the amphitheater, and team building. The high and low challenge courses are your chance to push yourself to the limit!

Program Center with dormitory-style rooms with bunks, flush toilets, and showers. Screened cabins have limited electricity and bunk beds, latrines, and a screened unit shelter nearby. Counselors sleep in a separate cabin or dorm room nearby.

## Northern Lakes Canoe Base

Moose Lake, Ely, MN

Our Northern Lakes Canoe Base is a cooperator with the USDA United States Forest Service, and we have a 60+ year history of safety on wilderness canoe trips. Rustic wilderness tripping camp offers fully outfitted canoe trips for girls and adults in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and Quetico Provincial Park in Canada. All participants sleep in tents.

## Camp Sanderson

Spicer, MN

Located about an hour southwest of St. Cloud on 33 wooded acres in Spicer, MN, the property is bordered by Nest Lake on two sides and Glacial Lakes State Trail on another. Camp Sanderson has a beautiful lake with swimming and boating, archery range, arts and craft pavilion, amphitheater, and the Bernice Harper hiking trail.

Permanent canvas-sided tent cabins with single beds and/or bunk beds, composting toilets, flush toilets and showers in Program Center. Counselors sleep in a separate tent cabin within the same unit.

## Camp Roundelay

Minong, WI

Located about an hour south of Duluth in the Gordon-Wascott area of Wisconsin, Camp Roundelay is located on 620 acres. It has two private lakes, a shower house, established waterfront and boating area, miles of hiking trails, amphitheater, and the Bernick's Storm Shelter. Camp Roundelay offers horse lovers the opportunity to learn about, ride, and care for horses with the Echo Lake Horse Ranch.

Screened stick-built cabins (no electricity), latrines, and shower house. Camp counselors sleep in cabins with girls.

## *Wilderness Canoe Trips in the BWCAW*

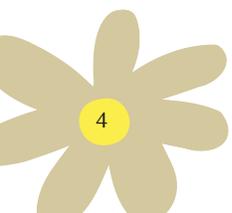

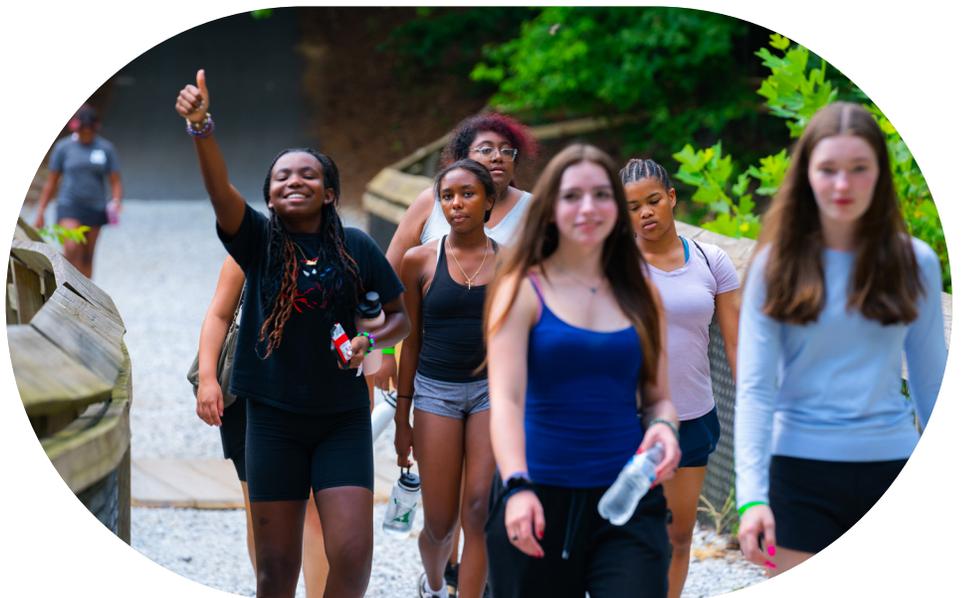

## Health Information & Requirements

To ensure the safe experiences for everyone, please submit the health forms that correspond to your camp session

### What forms do I need?

- For Camps 4 Days or Longer:
  - Overnight Camp Physical Form: Must be signed by a licensed practitioner within 12 months of the last day of camp (any physical after August 2025 is valid)
  - Immunization Records & Insurance Card. Please attach copies of both.
- For Camps 3 Days or Less (Including Family & Troop Camps)
  - Short Health History Form: Required for all participants (youth and adults).

### Pre-Camp Health Alerts

Please contact us before arrival if your camper:

- Has been exposed to a contagious condition (e.g., chicken pox, head lice).
- Has special dietary or health needs.
- Is attending with a recent injury (e.g., a broken arm) and has a doctor's permission to participate.

### Check-in Wellness Screenings

Upon arrival, all campers will undergo a quick health screening, including a temperature check and a screening for communicable diseases. To ensure a smooth check-in.

- Fever Procedure: Campers with a temperature of 100.4 F or higher will not be admitted.
- Lice Procedure: Please check your camper for head lice before arriving. Campers with an active case of lice or nits will not be allowed to stay. For tips on what to look for, visit [www.headlice.org](http://www.headlice.org).

# How Nuts and Cookies Can Send You Camping

## Explore more with Cookie Credits

Girl Scout camp is powered by the Girl Scout Product Program: Fall Product Program and the Girl Scout Cookie Program!

Sellers receive credits (Fall Bucks, Cookie Dough, Adventure Points) to help pay for summer camp programs and items purchased in the Girl Scout retail shops and camp trading posts. Girl Scouts Lakes & Pines encourages Girl Scout youth to participate in the Product Programs to create goals and assist in earning their way to camp!

Camper participation in the product programs helps the council cover the overhead expenses associated with camp such as property maintenance, utilities, insurance premiums and more!

Each camp requires a non-refundable deposit, but the remaining balance can be paid with Activity Credits. To apply activity credits to a camp balance simply bring in or mail the credits to one of our Girl Scout Regional Offices or mail to our Waite Park Office with a note indicating to which camper and which program the credits should be applied.

## Tips for using GSMWLP Fall Bucks, Cookie Dough Credits, etc. for troop camp payment:

- Mail or walk-in credits to the Waite Park or Duluth Regional office ASAP to have your gsEvents account credited before the full payment date. Please include details on how you would like the credit applied (camper name, session to apply credit).
- Snail mail bucks/credits to:
  - Waite Park: GSMWLP, 400 Second Ave South, Waite Park, MN 56387
  - Duluth: GSMWLP, 2122 W. Superior Street, Suite 1, Duluth, MN 55806
- Fall Bucks and Cookie Dough can only be used on girl fees.
- Adventure Point Credits can be used on girl or adult fees.
- Camp Care Day credits can be applied to girl or adult balances. Make sure you sign in at Camp Care Day to verify your attendance.

*\*Please allow up to two weeks for processing, you will be able to see the credit on your gsEvents balance once applied. All camp balances are due four weeks prior to session start date.*



## What Camp Counselors Wish Parents Knew About Camp

- If you pack with your camper, make sure they know what they have and where it is packed!
- Please let your counselors know if your child regularly wets the bed. This way, they can be prepared to discreetly change the sheets and wash bedding/night clothes in the morning, while the campers are at breakfast.
- Please send pre-addressed and stamped envelopes with your camper to write home.
- Bring separate towels for swimming and showering.
- Siblings don't always make the best buddies.
- Please don't tell your camper they can call if they get homesick!
- Put your camper's name on everything!
- Buddies don't have to choose all the same activities, but they will bunk and eat meals together.
- Campers will be expected to help clean up after themselves. Let them practice at home with simple chores, or Kapers, as we call them at camp.
- Many campers like to wear flip flops as shower shoes. They'll also need a comfortable pair of tennis shoes for games and activities around camp. Crocs do not make good camp shoes!
- There are no electrical outlets for campers to use.
- Practice letting your child shower alone and wash/brush their own hair before coming to camp.
- Be sure to pack a few extra changes of clothes in case they get wet or muddy and they need to change in the middle of the day.

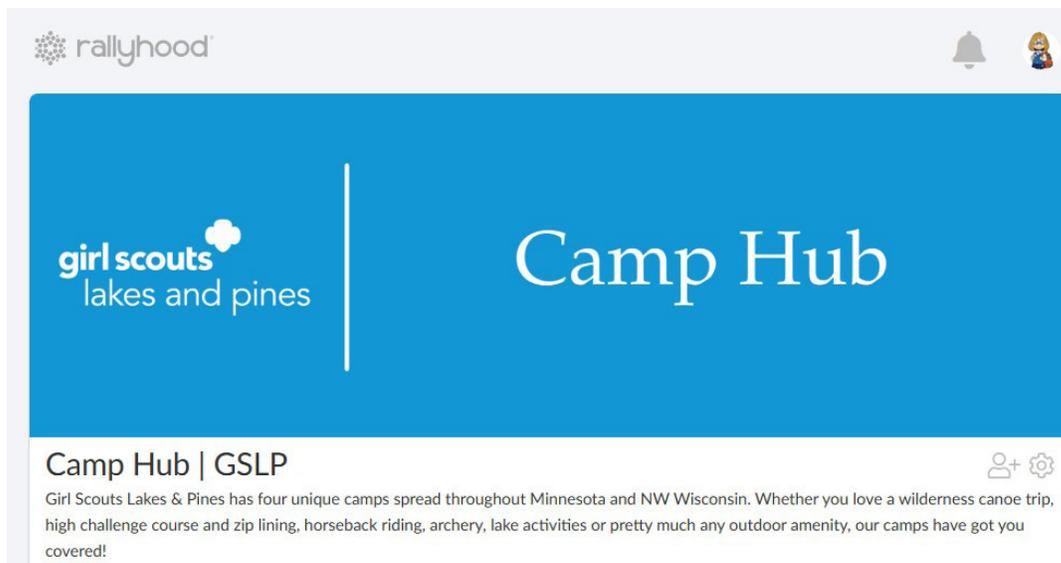

## Health and Safety at Camp: Keeping our Camp Community Healthy

The health and safety of our campers and staff is our highest priority. We follow the latest public health guidelines from the MN/WI Departments of Health, the American Camp Association and the Alliance for Camp Health.

**Illness Protocols:** To maintain a healthy environment, campers displaying two or more symptoms of a communicable illness may be tested for contagious diseases. If a camper tests positive or it is determined to be contagious, they will not be allowed to remain at camp. Close contacts will be monitored closely for symptoms.

**Stay Home When Sick:** If your camper is feeling unwell, please stay home! Campers or adults with communicable illness are not permitted at camp. If you camper cannot attend due to illness:

- **Transfer:** We can transfer fees to another available session
- **Refund:** If no other session is available, a refund will be issued (minus the non-refundable deposit)

- **Medical:** A written request and a physician's note must be received within two weeks of the session start date.
- **Family Emergency:** A written request is required. Please call to notify us within two days of the session start date.

## Cancellation by Choice

- **4+ Weeks Notice:** Refund minus the deposit and a 20% session fee.
- **Less than 4 weeks Notice:** No refund provided

## No Refunds

Refunds are not issued for:

- **Early Departure:** Including homesickness, behavioral issues or parental request
- **No-Shows:** "No-shows" are required to pay the session fee in full. Communication is the family's responsibility.

## Sessions and Date Transfers

We understand plans change! We offer one free transfer per camper. Any subsequent requests will incur a \$20 administrative fee.

If the council needs to move your camper to a different session (e.g. due to low enrollment), no fee will be charged. Our Camp Director team will always contact you before making any changes.
