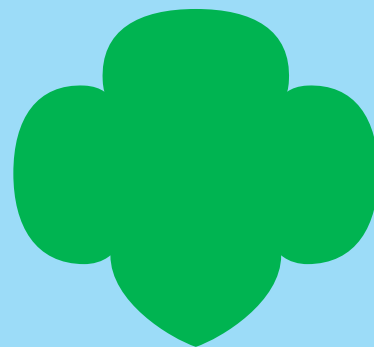

The last year at Girl Scouts of Minnesota and Wisconsin Lakes and Pines saw our local Girl Scouts achieve incredible new heights. We continue to be in awe of their dedication to their communities, to their Girl Scout sisters, and to making the world a better place.

During the 2024 Membership Year, Girl Scouts across our footprint showed us what it means to be a Girl Scout - to set goals, to go above and beyond, and to continue learning every step of the way.

- 99 Girls took action in their communities and earned their Highest Awards - the Girl Scout Gold, Silver, and Bronze Awards;
- Troops earned over \$1 million in proceeds through participating in the Fall Product Program and Girl Scout Cookie Program to fuel their Girl Scout adventures;
- Girl Scouts explored the world and traveled to Australia and New Zealand, Boston, and Chicago;
- Over 1,300 participants experienced outdoor adventure with camping, archery, horseback riding, and water fun across our four camp properties;
- Nearly 3,000 youth explored STEM, sports, culture, and more through hands-on programming;
- And so much more!

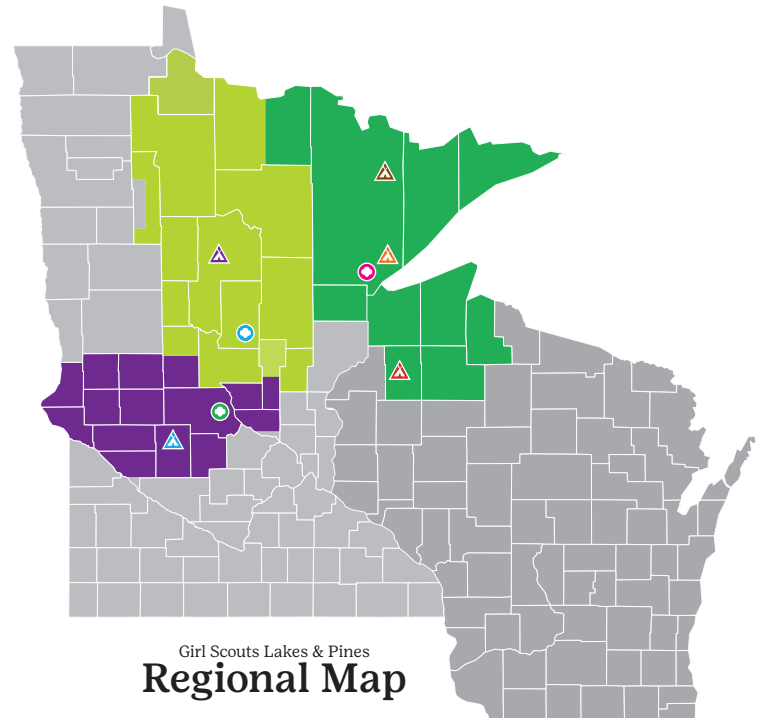

# Membership Year 2023-2024

In 2024, Lakes and Pines Girl Scouts continued to rebuild from the membership declines of recent years. We served 1,888 new members and 5,016 returning members, for a total of 6,904 members! Our staff provided 181 new troop leaders with training, resources, and a support network to help them become confident, successful leaders.

To support our dedicated volunteers, we served 96 adults through development opportunities at in-person events and retreats. Additionally, 90 volunteers attended virtual training sessions, and 520 course completions were recorded on our gsLearn training platform.

With our steadfast commitment to growth and volunteer support, Lakes and Pines is on our way to regaining our pre-pandemic membership levels. We're excited for the year ahead and the opportunity to engage even more girls in the transformative Girl Scout experience!

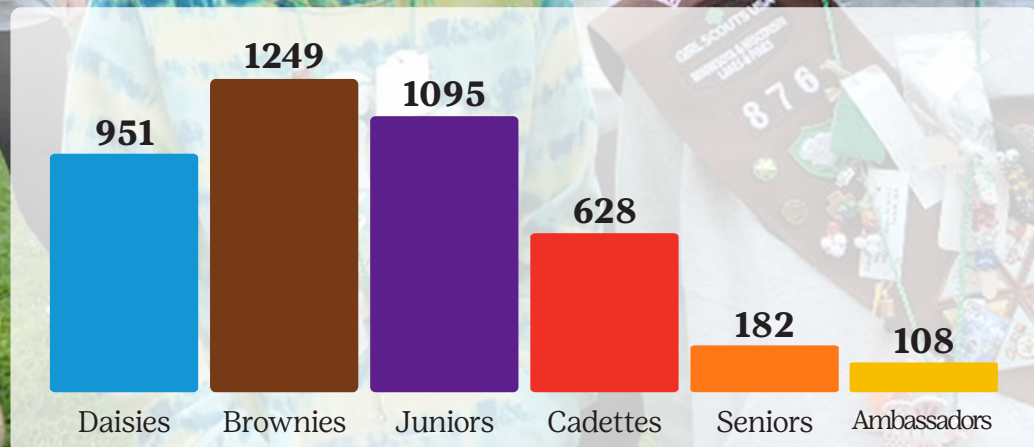

## Badges, Journeys, and Awards

The newest class of badges that launched in 2024 take on even more topics that Girl Scouts and their families care about such as updated First Aid K-12, Maker Series badges for K-5, updated Animal Badges for K-5 as well as an updated Girl Scout badge and award chart with new curriculum. No badges were retired this year!

Bilingual Troop Year Plan for first and second year Daisies and Brownies that included the Daisy Handbook, 12 Daisy Badges, and 11 Brownie Badges were created for a more equitable and inclusive experience. # Outdoor Experiences and Summer Camp

Outdoor activities are woven into the core leadership development programs in such a way that youth feel comfortable trying new things and testing their limits, they gain confidence and acquire new skills in a safe and supportive Girl Scout environment from swimming and horseback riding to canoeing adventures in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness and scaling the high challenge course and zipline. Girl Scout camps are able to offer a variety of options for all Girl Scout levels.

Each summer Girl Scouts Lakes and Pines hosts day camp, overnight camp, troop camp and Wilderness canoe trips at council properties. In addition, Girl Scouts participate in volunteer facilitated outdoor experiences throughout the year at council properties and Service Unit Day Camps.

The Program Team partnered with seven Service Units (SU 1, SU 7, SU 9, SU 15, SU 19, SU 21, SU 28) who facilitated day camps in their local service unit communities. An additional 283 Girl Scout Youth were served through the SU Day Camp pathway.

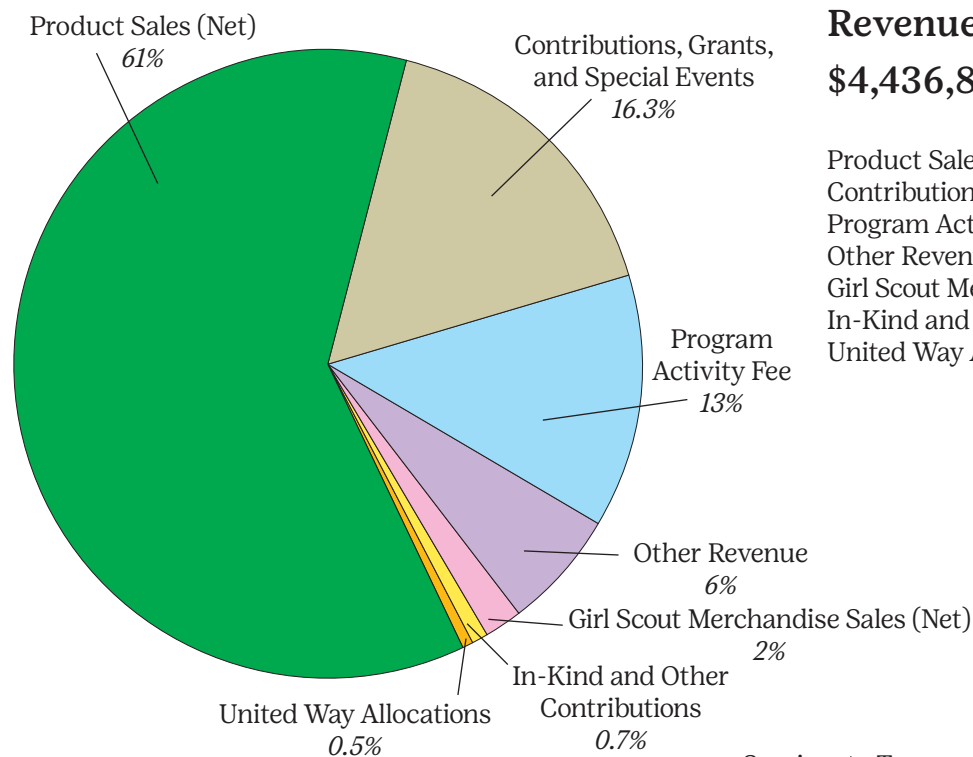

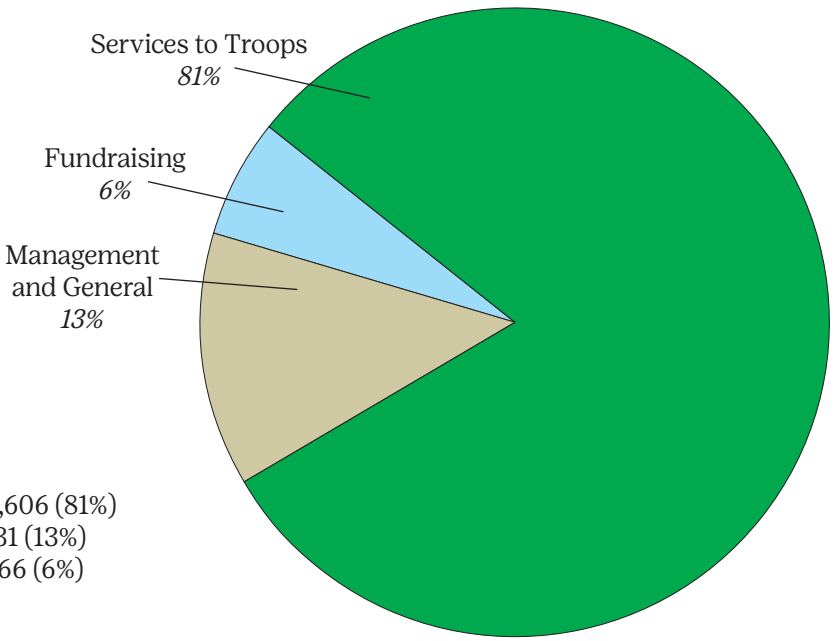
