This past year at Girl Scouts of Minnesota and Wisconsin Lakes and Pines was one of bold growth, meaningful action, and unforgettable experiences for the Girls, volunteers, families, and supporters who make our Council so strong.

Every day, Girl Scouts showed up as leaders, innovators, explorers, and changemakers. They challenged themselves, supported one another, and took real action to improve their communities and their world. Whether they were pitching a tent, building a robot, running a business, or advocating for change, our girls proved that courage, confidence, and character are more than values, they are lived experiences.

Here are just a few highlights from an extraordinary year:

- 37 Girls took action in their communities and earned their Highest Awards - the Girl Scout Gold, Silver, and Bronze Awards;
- Troops earned over \$650,000 in proceeds through participating in the Fall Product Program and Girl Scout Cookie Program to fuel their Girl Scout adventures;
- Girl Scouts explored the world and traveled to Costa Rica and Colorado;
- Over 1,300 campers experienced outdoor adventure with camping, archery, horseback riding, and water fun across our four camp properties;
- Nearly 3,000 youth explored STEM, sports, culture, and more through hands-on programming;
- And so much more!

None of this would be possible without the dedication of our volunteers, the trust of families, the generosity of our supporters, and the passion of our staff. Together, you help create spaces where girls can dream big, take risks, and discover who they are meant to be.

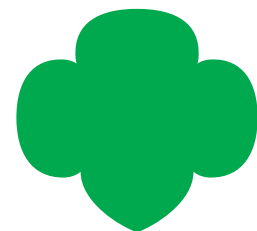

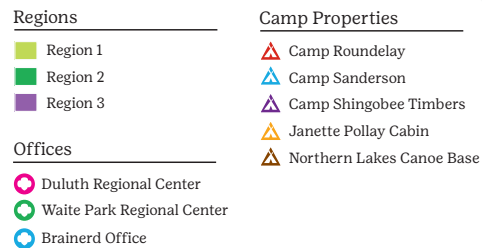
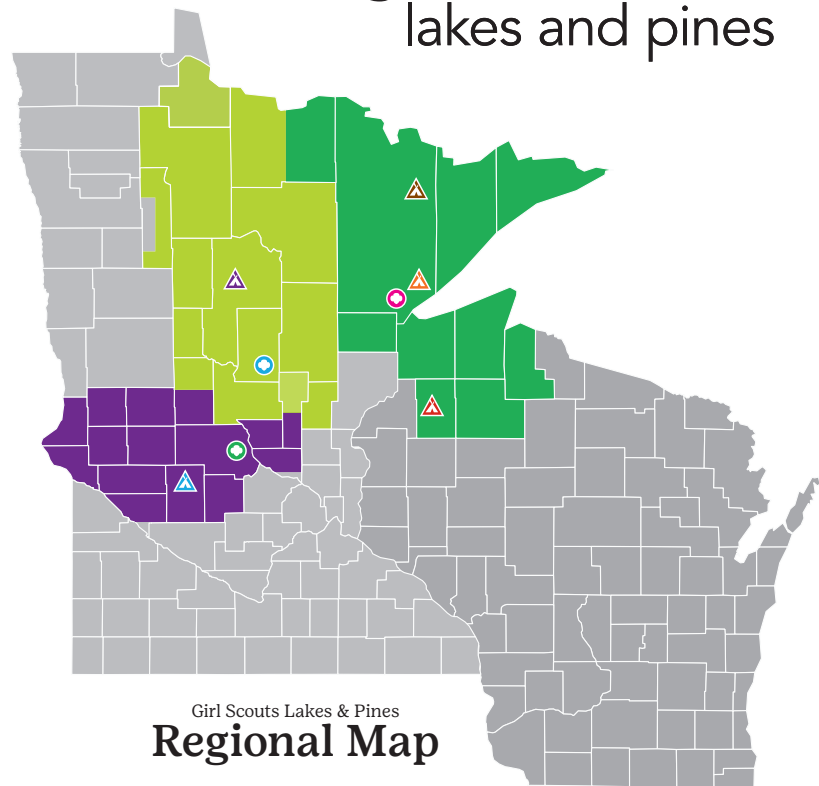

Girl Scouts Lakes and Pines is governed by a volunteer board of directors who guide strategic planning and manage council policy. Board members represent the geographic areas of the council and are elected by delegates at the Annual Meeting.

MEMBERSHIP YEAR 2025

In 2025, Lakes and Pines Girl Scouts focused on maintaining membership levels while continuing to deliver high-quality programming and volunteer support. We served 3,892 girls, including 1,061 new members and 2,831 returning members, alongside 2,608 adult members—562 new adults, 1,274 renewing volunteers, and 772 lifetime members—whose dedication made the Girl Scout experience possible across our council.

To support our dedicated volunteers, Lakes and Pines Girl Scouts served 374 adults through development opportunities at in-person training events held throughout the year. Additionally, 141 volunteers participated in virtual training sessions, and 2,299 course completions were recorded on our gsLearn training platform, reflecting a continued commitment to volunteer learning, preparedness, and high-quality program delivery for girls across our council.



With membership holding steady, we focused on strengthening troop experiences and ensuring volunteers had the support they needed to succeed. With a focus on troop quality and volunteer sustainability, Lakes and Pines ensured girls continued to have meaningful Girl Scout experiences rooted in their communities.

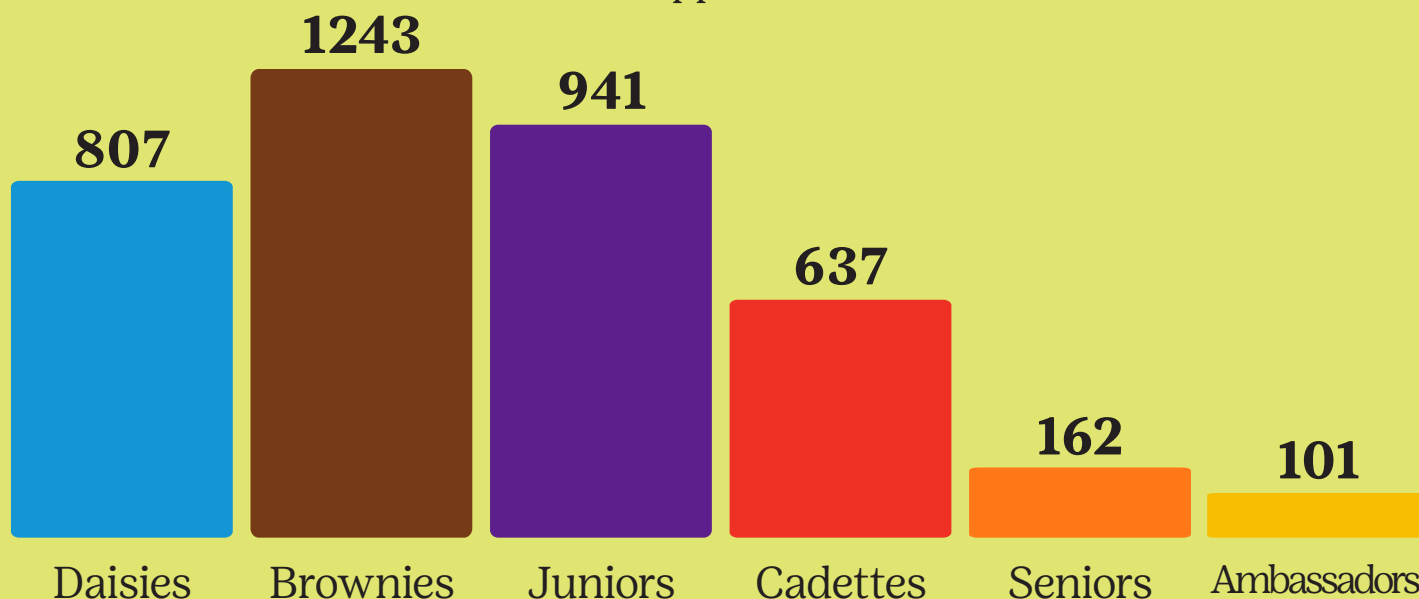

COUNCIL PROGRAMS & EVENTS

By investing in the four pillars of the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, STEM, Outdoors, Like Skills and Entrepreneurship, Girl Scouts Lakes and Pines provides the foundation for girls to lead. Our mission is simple but transformative: to cultivate courage, confidence, and character necessary for girls to make the world a better place.

This year was defined by milestone celebrations and expanded horizons. We marked the 40th anniversary of Our World Our Family and the 11th year of Kaleidoscope, our signature council events. Our commitment to innovation was bolstered by a new robotics curriculum, generously donated by Gold Award Girl Scout Makayla H. and the Becker Robotics Team #4607. From the heights of ice climbing and dog sledding to the depths of the Great Lakes and Sea Life Aquariums, our Girl Scouts explored the natural world through unique vendor programs.

Whether traveling internationally to Costa Rica or road-tripping the National Parks on the way to Colorado, our Girl Scouts are discovering that the world truly is their classroom.

NEW & UPDATED RESOURCES

To support membership engagement and retention, GSUSA continues to evolve our world-class programming. A highlight of 2025 was the launch of the new suite of Leadership Awards, categorized into Personal Leadership, Peer Leadership, Teaching Leadership and Community Advocacy. Whether working within a team or leading one, girls confidence and real-world skills like teamwork, problem-solving and strategic planning. Each award empowers girls of all ages to take action on what matters most to them.

Our Girl Scouts Leadership Experience (GSLE) also expanded this year with the introduction of the Body Appreciation badge for all levels and the Solutions Superstar logistics patch, made possible by DHL Supply Chain.

GSUSA also introduced strategic updates to the Volunteer Toolkit and Troop Year Plans. Expanded Girl Scout Experience Box to streamline Daisy and Brownie troop meetings. A new Welcome to Girl Scouts Guide and a robust suite of updated volunteer trainings were rolled out.



OUTDOORS & SUMMER CAMP

The great outdoors: Where Leaders are Forged. Outdoor Experiences are at the heart of the Girl Scout Leadership Development program. At Girl Scouts, Lakes & Pines, we provide a safe, supportive environment where girls are encouraged to test their limits and build lasting confidence. From the first splash in the lake to the grit required for a Boundary Waters canoe expedition, our Girl Scouts are acquiring skills that stay with them long after the gear is packed away.

Expanding Our Reach. This summer, our council properties hummed with activity, hosting a robust schedule of day camps, overnight sessions and troop camp adventures. Beyond our resident camps, the power of our movement was on full display through our camp properties at Roundelay, Sanderson, Shingobee Timbers and the Northern Lakes Canoe Base serving 1,329 participants.

By partnering with five Service Units (7, 9, 15, 19 and 21), the Girl Scout experience was brought directly into local communities, providing SU Day Camp to an additional 170 youth.

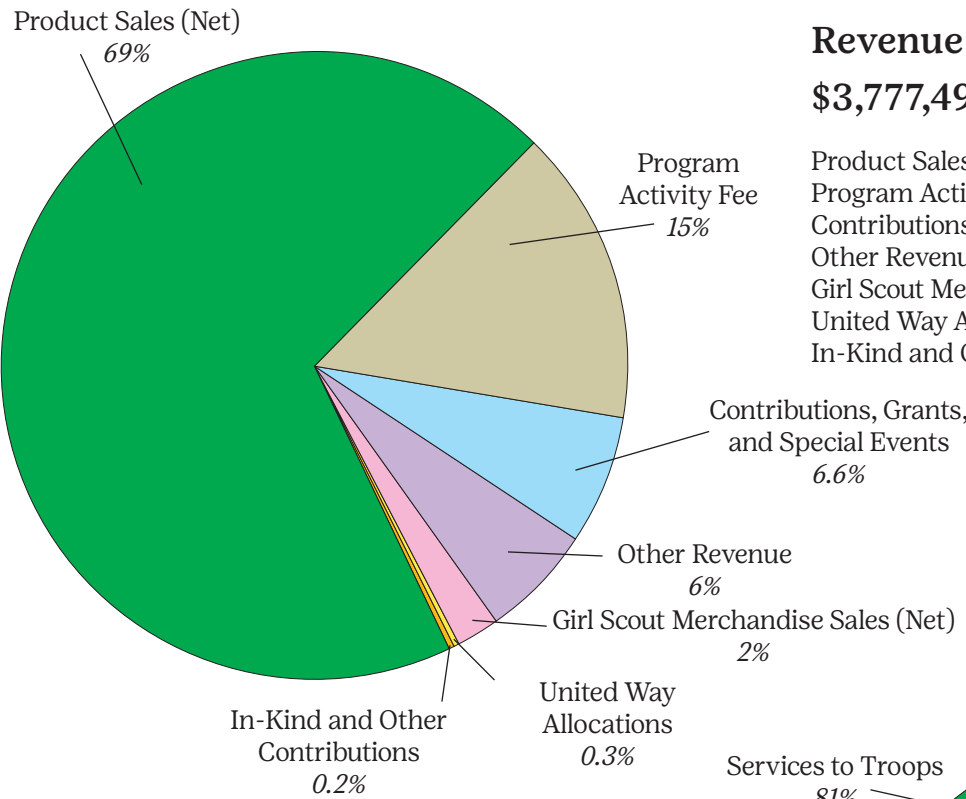

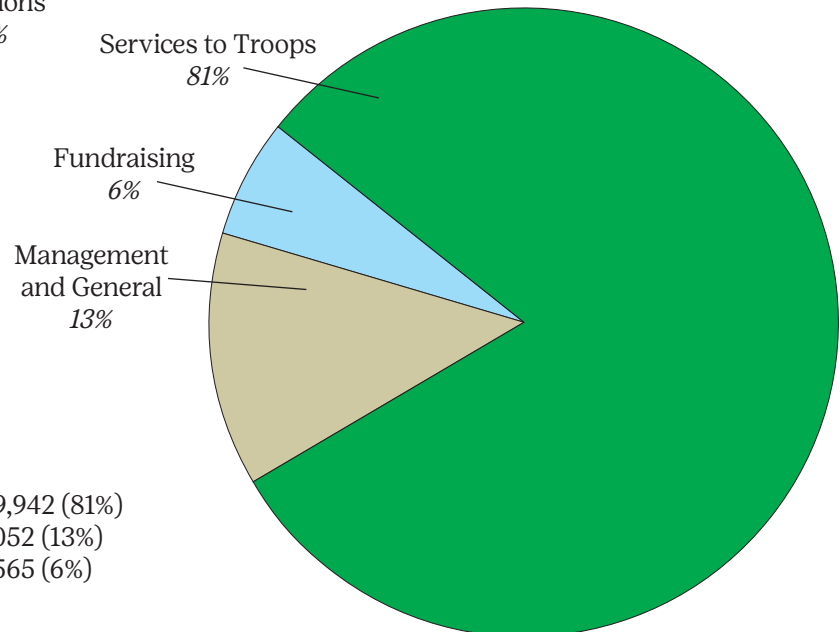
